

## Counting the Cost

Luke 14: 25-35

V26 The reality that no earthly Affection must ever come into Competition with the love of God.

V28-30 counting cost in building.

Wesleyan Quadrilateral. Scripture, tradition, Reason, and Experience

V31-32 counting cost in war.

The first example seems to reference the building up of the Christian Life and this cost seems to focus on the Battle that the Christian will have to undergo. Most of our heroes are selfish and rarely look to the *summum bonum* or the highest or greatest good. How many truly noble people do you know? How many people do you know refuse to do the wrong and seek the right path all the time. Is this not what a Christian is supposed to be?

Your convictions are not what you do when others are watching but what you do and how you live when no one is watching!!

V33 If you cannot forsake all you have then you cannot be a Disciple.

V34-35 Our Spiritual state of saltiness.

If our life is tasteless, and we are always complaining, then maybe this is a sign of a deeper Spiritual problem.
